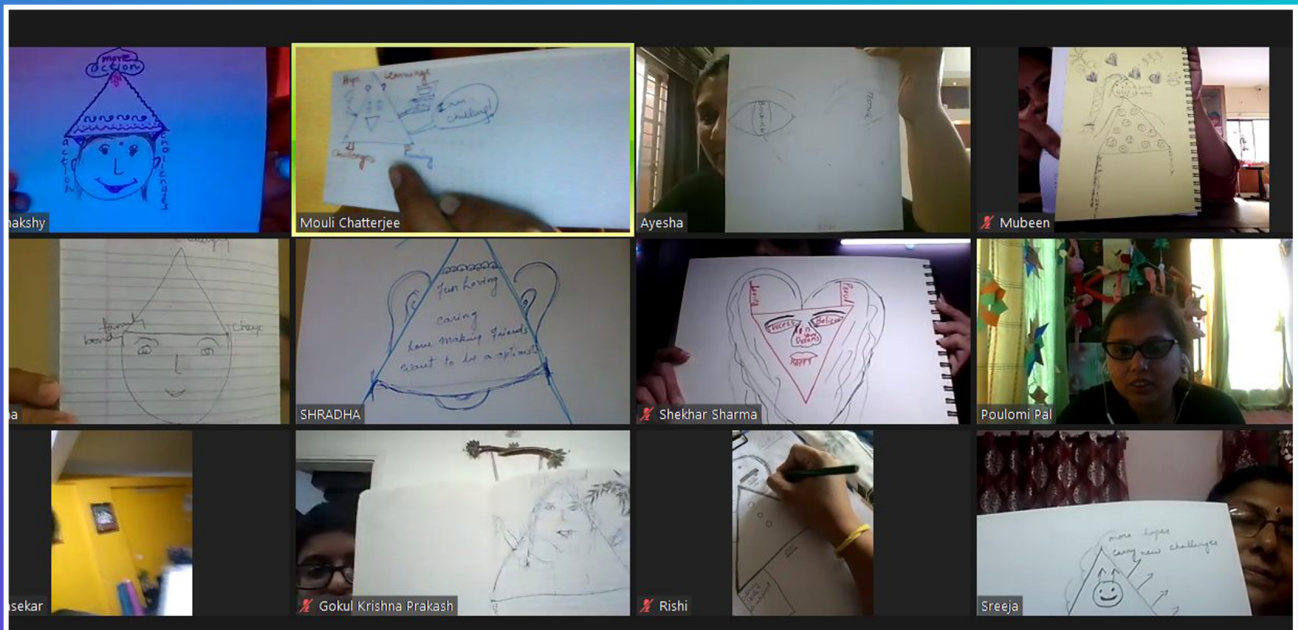


Fostering social inclusion during the 'New Normal'

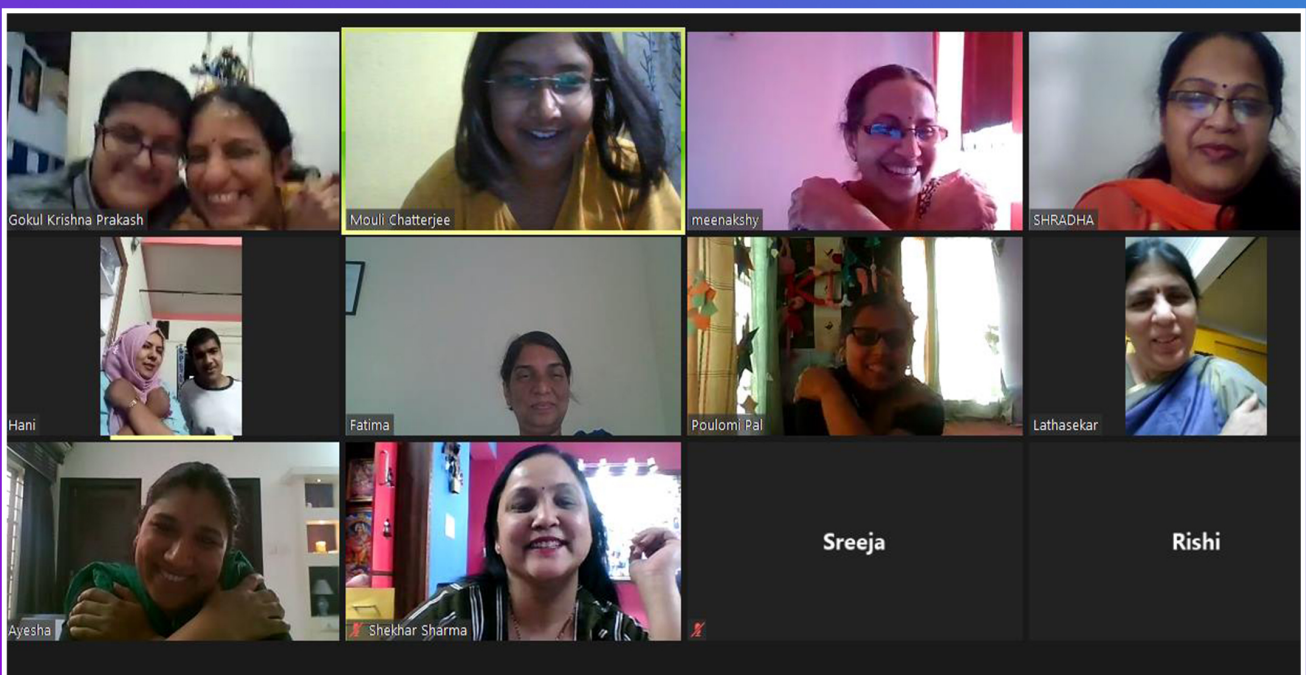

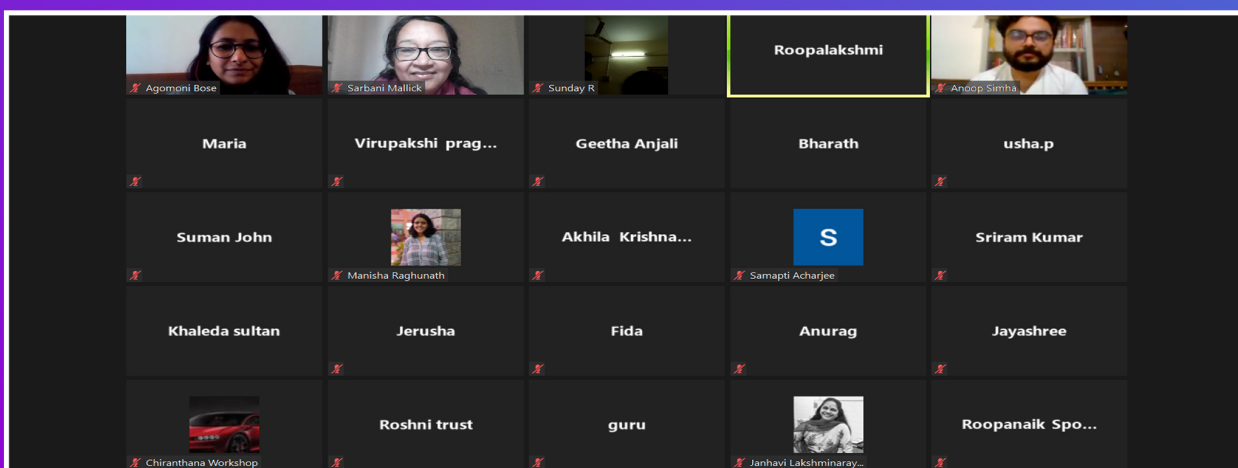
Making our presence felt

We look forward to focusing on individualized education plans to have a structured Primary Intervention unit for children with Delayed Development upto 10 years at these outreach partners.



We salute the commitment, spirit and heart of each member of the outreach partner teams who remain undeterred to reach the children and their families during these challenging times. In the past 6 months of the program, we have reached 94 children .
